PROJECTS HIGHLIGHTS

DIGITAL HORIZONS

We are delighted to have started this project which is designed to help young people consider ways to exploit their IT or other technical skills. With a focus on image based skills, 3D creating skills and internet/technical skills, over the course of the project we will bring professionals and experts in these fields to showcase how they generate income in these areas.









EMERGE

We are in the 2nd year of this John Lewis funded project that helps participants with generating ideas for and income from self-employment. Our Session Leaders and Coaches have worked with small groups and one to one to help participants to move their project ideas to self-employment. With a full programme of workshops covering topics such as business planning, legal framework, marketing ideas, getting customers and personalised coaching we have supported new and emerging business ideas from graphic design and printing to Ebay stores.

This project is showing us that with the right support individuals can work for themselves in a way that meets their needs.



3DMakethon

Thanks to funding from Jack Petchey Foundation we were able to devise a programme focused on participants collaborating to achieve a number of themed 'making' activities and challenges. Participants will team up to problem solve, create and design. As part of this project which will be delivered into the next financial year our facilitator will also use the tasks as an interesting context to encourage discussion on areas around wellbeing, confidence, life plans.



DISCOVERY

The Discovery Project was born out of a recognized need to provide a more foundational programme for individuals referred to Autus. For some people it is important to be in a safe space that encourages them to prioritise self-reflection; the time and support to consider where they are now, understand self and think about what they might want for their future. Receiving a small grant from John Lewis Legacy Fund enabled us to offer this programme at just the right time. We have seen a number of individuals benefit from Discovery and progress onto projects such as Digital Horizons. We are hoping to source further funding to enable us to provide another round of this programme.
